What is Art on the Trail?

Art, poetry, musings, and music greet hikers and saunters as our landscape areens and blooms along the Ice Age Trail segments in Lodi. We welcome artists, writers, and musicians.



What is the Ice Age Trail?

The Ice Age National Scenic Trail is a 1000-mile footpath that highlights some of the state's most beautiful natural areas. The Trail is entirely within Wisconsin and is one of only eleven National Scenic Trails. It is more than a path through the woods. It is a place for mental and physical rejuvenation, a place to unwind after a hard day and enjoy the landscape of Wisconsin. More than one million people use the Ice Age Trail each year.



What is the Ice Age Trail Alliance (IATA)?

The mission of the Ice Age Trail Alliance is to create, support and protect the footpath tracing Ice Age formations across Wisconsin on the Ice Age National Scenic Trail.



What is the Lodi Valley Chapter?

The Lodi Valley Chapter is one of 20+ local chapters of the Ice Age Trail Alliance. The chapter's volunteers maintain the trail, lead hikes, and promote usage of the trail. The chapter has also partnered with the City of Lodi to establish Lodi as an Ice Age Trail Community.
